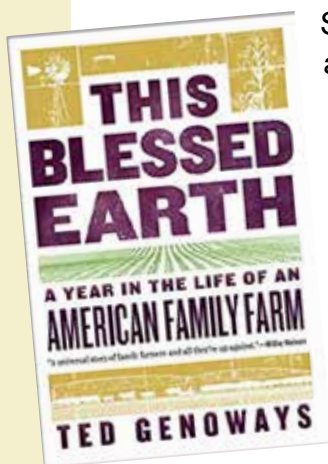


Daniel Tiger Movie

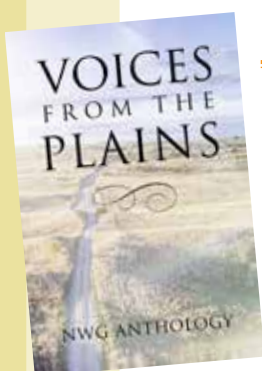


Local Nebraska Authors Showcase at the Library
